- Seal leaks around doors and windows.
- Lower the temperature on your water heater.
- Close blinds and curtains.
- Change or clean filters on your furnace.
- Install foam gaskets on electrical switches and outlets.
- Have a qualified contractor inspect your heating and cooling system annually.

Weatherization-related financial assistance programs may be available in your area to help upgrade your home to be more energy efficient.

- Contact Center phone number, natural gas leak emergency number, Oklahoma Natural Gas website and customer inquiry address.
- Your Oklahoma Natural Gas account information and bill amount.
- Your energy usage for the previous 13 months.
- Summary of rates and charges.
- Your natural gas usage information for the billing period.

Your Role in Meter Safety

There is no maintenance that you need to do to the natural gas meter on your property, but there are some safety tips you can follow to avoid damage so Oklahoma Natural Gas employees can always access the meter.

- Secure your pets away from meters, and never tie a pet to a meter.
- Do not stack anything on, attach anything to or cover a meter.
- Plant bushes, shrubs or trees far enough away to maintain a distance of 3 feet from the meter.
- Remove snow or ice from the meter carefully with a broom or brush, but never kick or try to chip it with a hard object.
