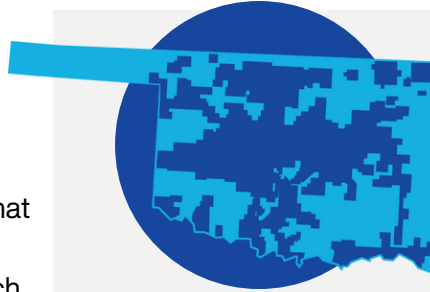

## Community Spotlights

We partnered with the **Oklahoma Center for Nonprofits** to support funding of its new headquarters in Oklahoma City. The organization helps improve the quality of life for Oklahomans by helping equip and strengthen the nonprofit sector through training, consulting, advocacy, membership, networking and awards. The facility will mainly be used for nonprofit members and administrative spaces.

In Tulsa, we worked with the **American Red Cross** to fund disaster recovery efforts for the June 2023 windstorm that heavily impacted the area. The fund covered unexpected costs resulting from the storm and aided affected residents, particularly low-income, elderly, disabled and other special needs populations.

## Kids Home for the Summer? Let's Talk Natural Gas Safety!

Your kids are out of school for the summer and spending more time around the house. With additional time spent with family, this is a great time to talk about natural gas safety.

Here are some tips you can share with them:

- When an adult is cooking on a stove, the flame should be blue, not orange. If you see it is orange, tell the adult immediately.
- While natural gas appliances can look cool, they're not toys. Don't play with knobs, switches or any part of the appliance.
- Natural gas smells like rotten eggs. This helps detect if there's a leak. If you smell natural gas, leave the area immediately, tell an adult and contact **911**, then Oklahoma Natural Gas at **800-458-4251**.
- You probably have a meter outside that delivers natural gas into your home. It looks like a gray box with dials and pipes leading out of it. Do not play around the meter or place items on top of it.
- Did you know natural gas travels underground through pipes? Playing in the dirt can be fun, but it's important to dig safely to avoid damaging these pipelines underground. If an adult is about to dig, they should contact 811 at least 48 hours, excluding the date of notification, weekends and holidays, before starting.
